LOWERHOUSE FOLD, Lowerhouse - Nos.2-22, Burnley, Lancashire, BB12 6LS

Row of 11 cottages. Circa 1820-30, for Dugdale's Lowerhouse Mill. Stone slate roofs (except No.6 which has composition tiles); late C19 brick chimneys.

Long rectangular double-depth plan, each cottage single-fronted, one window each. Doorways of Nos 2, 4 and 6 to the right, and the others to the left, all with plain surrounds (some with chamfered lintels) and altered doors.

Windows of Nos 2, 10, 14 and 22 with raised sills and plain reveals, those of Nos 4, 6, 8, and 16 with flush sills and plain reveals, and those of No.20 with raised surrounds, and all now with altered glazing.

Part of an intact early industrial colony at Lowerhouse, forming a group with Nos 217-227 Lowerhouse Lane adjoining to the left, and Nos 204-238 Lowerhouse Lane opposite.
